4. CEO Report - Ruth Jones

Operations

- We will continue to work with BIAK over the summer they supply crafts and have been reliable supports of the Library since before COVID. We had about 50 participants in the last program
- Let's Talk Science: CEO Ruth to confirm if the University will continue to participate over the summer. If they cannot participate, could we get more kits for use over the summer (at the Farmer's Market booth). We have had excellent feedback on the kits. The Grain Farmers of Ontario provided a kit as well.
- TD Reading Club launches in June they supply material.
- Red Cross: we've been distributing N95 Kits and Rapid COVID tests –
 CEO Ruth will be ordering more. Patti volunteered to contact the Lion's
 Club/Matawatchen Hall to see if they would like supplies through the
 Library so we can assure the community that we're supplying all the
 Wards.
- Photographers Guild Art Installation is coming this is an opportunity to have a creative talent outlet.
- Looking for other groups to offer opportunities to learn something new

 Tackleshare was one organization we were pursuing (they are
 currently backlogged). They supply fishing equipment/education to
 community groups.

6. Finance

Financial Statement

- o We finally received our completed Financial statement.
- o The auditors have confirmed we're doing everything correctly.
- We have this week to formulate and pose questions we do want to confirm we are receiving money from the Township to reflect their

- coverage of our 2021 computer purchases. This should be reflected when the Township finalizes their accounting.
- We would like to inquire if we qualified for any development costs from last year – only some purchases qualify. It is an opportunity to represent our growth differently from larger libraries. Any requests have to reflect growth in the community – we would have to develop and submit a plan.
- Overall we are pleased with the audit. We had no questions posed to us for clarification.
- We should have an overall financial picture by June.
- Our position to date:
 - We received a substantial financial donation from the Woman's institute (which sadly subsequently disbanded so they will be unable to continue to sponsor the Nancy Gorra Book Bag Program)
 - Rent showed up for the first time as a line item since we still cannot bring people in during the day, we are seeking rent relief.
 - Our donations are more than half of our projected target.
 - We continue to have a number of four steady volunteers.
 - We continue to burn through programming expenditures, we we'll have to look at pursuing other types of support and donations (e.g. paying for craft supplies)
 - Our remaining budget is \$69K plus for the remainder of 2022 once the computers come off our numbers may look even better.

7. Other Business

Next Meeting – June 8, 2022 @ 9 AM. This will be primarily a financial discussion.

Lucie will be meeting with the St Joe's PTA – there might be benefit for the Library to participate.

Lucie made a donation of resource materials related to children's' financial planning

Lucie suggested summer BBQs as a way to generate donations
