WHY?

Greater Madawaska is looking at ways to support local investment, strengthen businesses, and encourage improvements that help the community grow in a thoughtful and sustainable way. A Community Improvement Plan is one of the tools municipalities can use to help make that happen.

WHAT IS A CIP?

A CIP is:

- A way to encourage local investment
- A tool to help offset certain project costs
- Designed to support community priorities
- Optional — businesses choose whether to participate

A CIP is not:

- A change to zoning or land-use permissions
- A requirement to apply for funding
- A guarantee of funding
- A decision that has already been made

HOW DOES IT FIT?

The CIP is one part of how the Township implements its broader planning and economic development goals, including those outlined in the Strategic Plan.

While planning documents like Secondary Plans set long-term direction, a CIP focuses on practical tools that can help support investment on the ground.
